During Investigations in Term four, Grade One students will participate in a variety of learning experiences that link to the Geography focus. They will identify and describe places they consider to be 'special' and will also learn about sustainability by identifying different ways they can help care for special places. These learning experiences are also based on the children's interests, and link to other areas of the curriculum, such as Literacy and Numeracy.

















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Grade 3/4 News

Welcome back to all our Middle Sub School students and families to Term 4. Our Inquiry focus this Term is Geography. The students will be learning about Australian landscapes, cities and the states/territories. They will also learn about our closest neighbours- Indonesia and New Zealand. In Week 8, we will be going on an excursion to Cranbourne Botanical Gardens to discover the diversity and adaptations of animals and plants living amongst the extremes of Australian landscapes.

In Reading, students are working on developing their understanding of descriptive texts. They are then using this understanding to create their own descriptive texts during Writing.

The focus for Mathematics in the next two weeks will be fractions and decimals. Students will learn to problem solve with fractions and decimals in varying contexts. Please help them at home by encouraging them to complete their MY Numeracy tasks on Essential Assessment.

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School Saving Bonus

Dear parents and carers,

In Term 4 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.

The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Actions for parents and carers

Before 18th October 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

Complete enrolment: If your child, or children are changing government schools for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025. For more information, read about <u>Enrolling in School</u>.

Check your contact information: Ensure your email address and phone number is up to date with us. You can check this information by contacting us directly.

We need to ensure your contact information is up to date as the Department of Education will email you twice:

in October, to verify your email address

in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus and access to an online system.

Works notification



Upcoming site investigations – mid-September to early-December

We're removing the level crossing by closing Webster Street at the level crossing and building a new road under the rail line, connecting Princes Highway-Lonsdale Street to Cheltenham and Hammond roads.

We're undertaking investigations to help us understand local conditions and infrastructure, from mid-September to early-December, to inform how we'll build the new road underpass.

APA will also conduct investigations on the gas pipeline under Thomas Street and Woodcock Reserve.

What we're doing

- Investigating road and ground conditions
- Locating underground services
- Investigating rail conditions

We'll work from 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and from 7am to 3pm, Saturdays. We'll also work some Sundays and at night to minimise traffic disruptions.

Access to businesses and homes will be maintained at all times.

Traffic management will be in place to assist drivers, pedestrians and bike riders.



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We are SunSmart

- a note for families

Too much of the sun's ultraviolet (UV) radiation can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage and skin cancer.

UV damage accumulated during childhood and adolescence is associated with an increased risk of skin cancer later in life. Skin cancer is the most common cancer in Australia. It is also one of the most preventable cancers.

You can't see or feel the sun's UV. Whatever the weather, if the UV levels are three or more, it's important to Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek and Slide!

Sun protection times

Don't just wait for hot and sunny days to use sun protection. Check the sun protection times each day so your family can be protected when they need to be.

Daily local sun protection times and weather details are available from the SunSmart widget on our school website, in the weather section of the newspaper, on the SunSmart website at sunSmart.com.au and as a free SunSmart app. Sun protection times can also be found at the SunSmart.com.au and as a free SunSmart app. Sun protection times can also be found at the SunSmart.com.au and live UV levels are available from ARPANSA.

SunSmart membership

Our school is a registered member of Cancer Council Victoria's SunSmart Schools Program. We aim to protect children and staff from too much UV.

Sun protection and skin cancer prevention is a shared responsibility. Please help support our SunSmart membership and sun protection efforts by ensuring your child follows the SunSmart measures included in our policy at school and at home.

During the daily local sun protection times (usually from mid-August to the end of April), use these 5 SunSmart steps – even if it's cool and cloudy.

1. SLIP on covering clothing

For free dress days, ensure your child wears clothing that covers as much skin as possible (e.g. elbow length tops with a higher neckline or collar and longer style shorts or skirts). Densely woven fabrics are best.



2. SLOP on SPF30 (or higher) broadspectrum, water-resistant sunscreen

Apply a generous amount of sunscreen at the start of the day and make sure children have sunscreen in their bag ready to reapply throughout the day. Sunscreen should be reapplied every two hours. Please ensure children get plenty of sunscreen application practice at home so they'll be all set when they are at school. Under supervision, ask children to put a dot of sunscreen on each cheek, nose and chin and rub it in (avoiding the eye area) and sunscreen squiggles or dots on the back of the neck, arms and legs to cover these areas.

3. SLAP on a hat that protects the face, neck and ears

Choose a wide-brimmed, legionnaire or bucket hat. Peak caps and visors do not offer enough UV protection so please leave them at home. Please help your child remember to bring and wear their approved school hat. Please keep this at school so they will always be ready for outdoor activities, outdoor learning and play during school days. For the walk to and from school and weekends, please have an extra home hat to help keep children protected at home.

SEEK shade

Choose shady spots for learning and play whenever possible.

SLIDE on wrap-around AS1067 sunglasses
 When appropriate and practical, help protect the eyes with sunglasses.
